The Lanteglos by Camelford TA features a small tenement of six plots named "Inn Parks". OCS research found no evidence of related "Inn" surnames, such as Innis or Innes in the parish. It may be a shortening of 'Inn(er) Parks' but this could not be verified.

Although there is no definitive link, the Western Inn and Volunteer Inn were on the same High Street leading in to Camelford. Therefore English 'inn' was considered the most likely origin.

Blisland

Blisland = **Trevlidlh**

A paper by Andrew Breeze presented research on the etymology of Blisland. The findings suggested an Anglo-Saxon origin rather than Celtic, possibly a personal name such as 'Blitha'. The Panel agreed an amendment of the current "Blus" to "Trevlidlh" but leaving the etymology as obscure.

Blisland (Civil Parish) = **Pluwvlidlh**

Blisland (Ecclesiastical Parish) = **Pluw Vlidlh**

Plenys an gwari

The CC Historic Environment Team submitted a request to verify 17 possible Plen an Gwari sites across Cornwall. The names provided are field names from the Lanhydrock Atlas. Decisions were deferred to allow the Panel time to review the locations.

Corneal = **Korngaran**

Containing *korn* 'corner' + *garan* 'crane'. The name itself is Saxon *corn* 'crane' + *healh* 'corner, nook'.

Bonds Corneale = **Korngaran Bond**

Potes Corneale = **Korngaran Pote**

Cotehele Quay = **Kay Kosheyl**

Cross = **Krowsven**

There is a tenement of properties named "stone cross" and "cross" on the St Dominick TA.

Dairy Mill = **Melin Leti**

Eastcott = **Bos an Est**
