5	Arwodhow yn stretow / Street signs Cheviot Road, Newquay = Fordh Keyyes From 'The Cheviot' in Northumberland. A name first recorded as <Chiuiet> in 1181. It is thought to be Brittonic, containing *ceμ- "ridge" and <-ed> "having the quality of" (see Wikipedia: "The Cheviot"). Frith Road, Saltash = Fordh Frith Garlenick, Grampound with Creed = Karlynnek There is map evidence showing a Round named "Burghgear" to the southeast of Garlenick. Suggesting the first element is <i>kar</i> 'fort' + <i>glynnek</i> 'wooded valley'. Garlenick Wood is recorded as

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ancient woodland.

Pengover Road, Liskeard = **Fordh Penngover**

Riverside Crescent, Newquay = **Gwarak an Dhowrlan**

Tregonhaye, Falmouth = **Trega'nhay**

Containing *trega* 'enclosed settlement' + *an* 'the' + *hay* 'hedge'.

Treloyhan Park Road, St Ives = **Fordh Park Trelughyon**

Wall Vian, Wall = **Gwall Vian**

There may have been a wall leading from Wall Farm to Lemin Farm. This appears to create an eastern boundary around Reawla. The settlement of 'Wall' may have been a reference to a boundary around the royal site of Reawla.

North Quay, Hayle – Building names

The Panel received a research request for a new section of the North Quay development in Hayle. Initial research identified the following features on the site:

- Hayle Glassworks, a bottle factory
- Associated Octel works, extracting bromine for aviation fuel
- Pentowan Calcining Works
